Tourism Economy Study for July 4th week

The preliminary sampling results from Coastal's voluntary sample of hotel, condo-hotel and campground properties along the Grand Strand from May 27 to July 7 have been released. Of the the 8,789 lodging units in the sampling, 79.3 percent were occupied. This figure is down by 2.1 percent compared to last year. Approximately 80 percent of the vacation rental homes in the random sampling of properties were reserved, which is up by 3.2 percent compared to the same time last year. The data are collected and analyzed by CCU's Clay Brittain Jr. Center for Resort Tourism and the Coastal Federal Center for Economic and Community Development.

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Var Limpasuvan's article "Stratospheric gravity wave simulation over Greenland during 24 January 2005" was published in the recent issue of the American Geophysical Union's Journal of Geophysical Research. Co-authored by CCU student James Perkins, the

article highlights a realistic simulation of small-scale atmospheric perturbations over the Greenland terrain and their verification with satellite observations.

Danny Nicholson was one of six winners of a research writing contest sponsored by the Council for Advancement and Support of Education (CASE). Nicholson, vice president for university advancement, was recently recognized with the five other winners at the CASE Summit for Advancement Leaders in Chicago. He won the John Grenzebach Award for Outstanding Doctoral Dissertation for "Leading Where it Counts: An Investigation of the Leadership Styles and Behaviors that Define College and University Presidents as Successful Fundraisers," completed at the University of South Carolina. Nicholson's dissertation examined how four university and college presidents use effective leadership techniques to enhance fundraising.

John Reilly of the department of chemistry and physics recently presented at the Gordon Research Conference on Photochmemistry in Smithfield, R.I. The title of his presentation was "Photochemical Inhibition of the Enzyme Histidase by PUVA Therapy."
