LD PHONE ACCESS MEANS AN EXTRA 5

Long distance access has changed, following the installment of USC-Columbia's new telephone system. Dial as before, just add an extra '5' to what you already dial: such as 65 - 5 - 5 or 63 - 5 - 5. To dial within South Carolina, the number might look like this: 65 - 5 - 5 - 1 - 441 - 8351. To dial outside of the state, just add area code as usual: 65 - 5 - 5 - 1 - 919 - 893 - 8351.

Student parking behind the Academic Building will be blocked Tuesday because of Jihan Sadat's visit to the campus. This will make room for campus visitors, and will help in security arrangements. The college regrets that this may cause an inconvenience for students that day.

JIHAN SADAT VISITS TUESDAY

Jihan Sadat, widow of slain Egyptian President Anwar Sadat, will speak in Wheelwright Performing Arts Center at 10 a.m. The lecture is free. Mrs. Sadat will visit as part of the Kimbel Distinguished Guest Lecture Series. Faculty, staff and students will find that security is strict and that large briefcases, camera bags, etc. probably will be searched. It may be best to leave these items locked in your offices, or to at least expect these items to be searched. The inconvenience is necessary for Mrs. Sadat's safety. Attendance at the reception is limited to the Cabinet and Dean's Council, also because of restrictions made by Mrs. Sadat's security staff.

The debate, which took place at Gage Hall, was modeled after the most recent Presidential debates, with a panel of four, led by the S.C. Sen. Herbert U. Fielding, probing the relevant issues of the topic with questions for the debaters.
