England: Books 1100-1200" held on July 6-8. Glaze, a history professor, has also just been awarded a Wellcome Trust Travel Grant to fund a short research trip to London this fall. She leaves to take up an 11-month Mellon fellowship at the American Academy in Rome on Sept. 1.
