SAXENA NAMED COASTAL'S OUTSTANDING TEACHER FOR THE YEAR

Dr. Subhash Saxena, a professor of mathematics, was named Outstanding Teacher of the Year by the Student Government Association. Dr. Saxena, who went to Columbia Friday for the USC-System competition, said the award was "better than getting an Oscar." Each school at USC Coastal Carolina College selects a candidate. Three finalists are then selected and the Student Government Association interviews the finalists and announces its choice for the honor. Finalists this year were Paul Peterson, associate professor of political science, and Gerald Boyles, professor of business administration.

PROFESSOR RECEIVES SCIENCE GRANT

Chris Marsh, assistant professor of biology and marine science, recently received an award of \$11,530 from the National Science Foundation. This project, under the direction of Baruch Institute for Marine Biology and Coastal Research, will examine how environmental heterogeneity affects biotic interactions among consumers of a salt marsh community.
