**Zdzisław Sikora's** intaglio "Memento Mori," is part of the "Point of Departure" portfolio now on exhibition at both the galleries of the World Print Council, San Fancisco, Calif. and the Hartford Art School, Hartford University, West Hartford, Conn. The San Francisco show will show through May, and the Hartford Show runs to Aug. 1.

**Dr. S. Ballou Skinner**, professor of physics, has been awarded a summer fellowship by Universal Energy Systems to conduct research at Arnold Engineering Development Center in Tullahoma, Tennessee for the U.S. Air Force and NASA. The research will involve the evaluation of the limits of testing of a neutral beam in a space system environmental simulated chamber and the provision of a radiation monitorial system capable of evaluating the damaging effects of a neutral beam of variable energies upon the personnel, equipment, and the testing chamber.

**Dr. James March**, assistant professor of piano at Coastal Carolina College, has advanced to the semifinal round of the International Young Keyboard Artist Piano Competition in Grand Rapids, Michigan. The competition began with preliminary rounds in December and the original field of approximately 900 contestants has been narrowed to 40. The semi-finals and finals will take place from June 16-22 in Michigan. **Thomas E. Jones,** assistant professor of Speech-Theatre, and the cast of Edgar Lee Masters' "Spoon River Anthology" recently performed at the Arts Alive festival that was held on the Francis Marion College campus in Florence. The festival included performances by the Florence Civic Ballet, Coker College Drama Department, West Florence High School, the Florence Little Theatre and the Francis Marion College Theatre.

Dr. Dennis Sanderson, the organizer of the Festival, praised Coastal Carolina's production of "Spoon River" as a very strong ensemble performance. Students from Jones' Beginning Acting class that participated were: James Elliott, Terry Dix, Teralena Haymond, Karen Frank, Lisa Rhue and Hugh Washington. Jones directed the production. Earlier, "Spoon River" was presented for the Spring Arts Festival here on the Coastal Campus and also for a readings program by the English 485 class.
