Linda Hollandsworth recently served on a National Collegiate Athletics Association Certification peer review team that visited Florida A&M University in Tallahassee, Fla.

Ten Coastal students and two of their advisers attended the National College Media conference in Washington, D.C., Oct. 24 to 28. Attending were Chanticleer staffers: Caroline P. Smith (editor), Meg Duvall (assistant editor), Yaw Odame (art director), Raytevia Evans (features editor and Claire Arambula. Archarios editor Megan Fisher and art director Jeremy Alford made the trip, along with Tempo editor Stephanie Hutto, assistant editor Lauren Formalarie and art director Rob Byrd. Advisers Linda Hollandsworth and Mona Prufer went as well. Hutto was awarded an honorable mention for her photos in the photo contest hosted by the conference.

Monair Hamilton, assistant professor of health promotion, was recently awarded a \$1,000 grant from SharedCare (Horry County) to facilitate cultural competency workshops for medical providers and their staff members. The workshops will be held at regional medical centers and will address the norms, values, traditions and communication styles concerning the prevention and management of diabetes, hypertension and obesity in African-American communities.

Agatha O'Brien-Gayes has been named director of academic advising as of Nov. 1. Previously, she worked as adjunct faculty in the Wall College of Business and, since 2006, when the University Academic Center was formed, she has been an academic adviser to first-year students. O'Brien-Gayes developed the Remote Operated Vehicles for the First Year Experience program which received NASA funding. In five FYE classes, students built remotely operated vehicles to accomplish underwater research. O'Brien-Gayes was also instrumental in developing the First-Year Experience program, serving on the planning committee, co-authoring the faculty manual and facilitating faculty workshops from 2006-2007.
