Michael Ruse, associate professor of philosophy and religion, has been putting in 70-hour weeks, recording the names of more than 58,000 Vietnam veterans. Aided by **David Parker**, who set up a mini-recording studio in Ruse's office, Ruse and his wife Lisa Ivers recorded and edited the names that were read mostly by Vietnam veterans and spouses from the Little River VFW. The Vietnam Veterans Memorial Moving Wall, on display at Broadway at the Beach last month, was visited by more than 50,000 people. One of the requirements of securing the wall for a visit is that the names must be read aloud, Ruse said. About 80 hours went into the reading and recording of the names, with another 30 to 60 hours of editing. The tolling of the names will be copyrighted, Ruse said, and put onto an iPod so that it'll be available for other recipients of the Moving Wall.
