Renowned historian and Lincoln scholar named Burroughs Professor at CCU

Vernon Burton, distinguished historian and author of the critically-acclaimed "The Age of Lincoln," has been named Burroughs Distinguished Professor of Southern History and Culture at Coastal Carolina University, effective fall 2008. Burton was selected for the position after a national search. He will succeed Charles Joyner, who retired early this year after holding the professorship since it was created in 1988.

Teresa Burns and Louis Keiner presented an invited talk at the Southeast Regional Meeting of the American Physical Society, held at Vanderbilt University in Nashville, Tenn., on Nov. 10. The paper was titled "Physics Education Reform: An Object Lesson from Coastal Carolina University." The talk dealt with the implementation of the SCALE-UP model of physics instruction, which combines lecture and laboratory into a single entity, and emphasizes active learning and student cooperation. Keiner and Burns reported a major impact on both student grades and performance on standardized tests.
