## **RONALD G. EAGLIN NAMED ACTING CHANCELLOR AT USC COASTAL CAROLINA**

University of South Carolina President James B. Holderman announced Tuesday the appointment of Ronald G. Eaglin as Acting Chancellor at USC Coastal Carolina College.

Dr. Eaglin has been Vice Chancellor for Academic Affairs at USC Spartanburg since 1974. In that position, he had direct supervision of all operations of four academic schools, the Graduate Regional Studies Program, Library, Registration, Computer Services, Computer Studies, International Education, Continuing Education, Developmental Studies and Institutional Research and Grants.

USC Coastal Carolina College's Acting Chancellor has over 20 years of administrative experience including his 11 years at USC Spartanburg, four years as a Regional Director of a national testing firm, two as Assistant Dean of Students at the University of Nebraska, three as Assistant Director of Residence Halls at the University of Utah, and two as coordinator for Group Housing at Southern Illinois University.

Dr. Eaglin has a Ph.D. in Educational Philosophy from the University of Utah. He was awarded an M.Ed., in College Student Personnel Administration With A Concentration in Psychology from Southern Illinois University; and a B.S. degree in Education from Southeast Missouri State University, where his majors were Biology and Mathematics.

Dr. Fred W. Hicks resigned from the Chancellor's post June 31. He will be a tenured professor teaching in the Department of History.
