COASTAL CAROLINA SPONSORS PROGRAM FOR FOUR-YEAR OLDS

Children ages four to five years old will have a program developed just for them beginning July 22 at Myrtle Beach Primary School. The "Coastal Carolina College For Young Children" project will meet Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays through the last class day of Thursday, August 8. Instructors will be Jackie Anderson, who has public school teaching experience with a specialty in early childhood education, and Janet Files, an education consultant. The Office of Continuing Education is in charge of the program, which will focus on the development of language skills in young children. Registration fee is \$45, with a \$5 materials cost. Enrollment will be limited, and registration deadline is July 18. The classes will be from 9 -11:30 a.m. Contact the Office of Continuing Education for details.

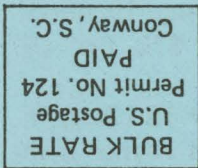

IMMUNIZATION POLICY AT COASTAL CAROLINA

The outbreaks of measles and rubella on college campuses across the United States during the academic year 1984-85 have been of epidemic proportions, as reported by the Center for Disease Control. Coastal Carolina College and the University of South Carolina have implemented a policy that all susceptible individuals must be immunized to measles and rubella. This policy requires individual students to furnish to the College proof of this immunization. Dr. Robert W. Squatriglia, Associate Chancellor for Student Development, is spearheading the immunization program at Coastal Carolina. Some students are exempt from immunization. They are:

- 1) Individuals born prior to 1957
- 2) Individuals providing written physician documentation of immunization for rubella and measles after 1969
- 3) Pregnant females, or females who suspect they are pregnant
- 4) Seriological rubella titer conforming immunization to rubella and measles

A copy of the Immunization Policy will be going to each new student.
