FACULTY/STAFF

Dr. Walter Stanaland of the School of Mathematics and Computer Science will present a paper entitled, "Beach Erosion Mechanics" at the Fourth Symposium on Coastal Management, called "Coastal Zone 85," in Baltimore, Md., Aug. 2. This conference has over 50 sponsoring and affiliate organizations from industry, government, and environmentalists. Dr. Stanaland's paper will be presented in the session entitled "State of the Art in Models and Providing Real-Time Information." The paper discusses the theoretical nature of Coriolis Forces and their relation to erosion or accretion of sand at the land sea boundary. Dr. Stanaland's theory indicates that north-south oriented beaches are more vulnerable to erosion than east-west oriented beaches when off-shore storms occur. His theory provides a reason why beach erosion occurs mostly during winter and accretion occurs mostly during the summer months along the Carolina coasts.
