Coastal paid \$500,000 toward the property, with the Rices making a gift of the remaining balance.

Retired businessman Thomas P. Brown Jr., his wife Jessie Brown and their son Thomas P. Brown III have made a \$100,000 gift to Coastal Carolina University. The gift will establish the Each One Teach One Entrepreneurship Institute in CCU's E.
