The CCU football team will open next year against Penn State in University Park, Pa., Aug. 30. The contest will mark the first time the Chanticleers face a team in the Football Bowl Subdivision (formally Division I-A) when they travel to State College.

Women's Track and Field Competes at Tom Jones Memorial Classic

The Lady Chanticleers finished third in the distance medley relay, while redshirt junior LeAuna Sistrunk was 10th overall in the 55-meter hurdles.

Men's Basketball Loses at Winthrop, 65-43

The Chanticleers trim the margin to nine in the second half but can get no closer before losing to the host Eagles, 65-43, Jan. 26. Senior guard Jack Leasure led Coastal with 18 points but was the only Chanticleer in double figures.

Blanchard, Stull Have Career Highs but Women's Basketball Falls to UNC Asheville 63-54

Senior Vicky Blanchard had a double-double with 19 points and 15 rebounds while sophomore Amanda Stull had a career high 16 points, but a 13-2 run by UNC Asheville midway through the second half propelled the Bulldogs to a 63-54 win over the Coastal Carolina University women's basketball team Jan. 26.

Two Coastal students and a faculty member presented papers at the recent 2008 Biennial Convention of Phi Alpha Theta, the history honor society. **Meggan Farish,** a Myrtle Beach junior, presented a paper entitled "The Fireside Chats of Franklin Delano Roosevelt." **Bogdan Grechka**, a senior who is presently completing his coursework at a university in Russia, presented a paper entitled "The Civilizing Mission in the Belgium Congo: Exploitation, Slavery, and Genocide." Farish was inducted into Phi Alpha Theta along with 22 other students in November. Grechka, a history major from upstate New York, is a member of Coastal's Honors Program. Accompanying them on the trip was associate professor **John Navin**, adviser to Coastal's chapter of Phi Alpha Theta. Navin is the organization's Southeast region area adviser; he presented a paper entitled "Linking History Courses to Elementary School Mentoring Efforts." The conference took place in Santa Ana Pueblo near Albuquerque, New Mexico. Coastal history majors have presented papers at the past three Phi Alpha Theta biennial conferences.

Robert B. Burney, associate professor of finance, has earned the Certified Management Accountant (CMA) designation from the Institute of Certified Management Accountants. The designation is given to accountants who have displayed proficiency in many facets of accounting and financial management.

Eric Koepfler of the Department of Marine Science recently returned from an International Sea Turtle Symposium (ISTS) meeting held in Loreto, Mexico, where he presented "Caretta caretta Nest Temperatures in Hatcheries at Cape Romain: South Carolina, USA: Determinants of Spatial and Temporal Variability." **Paul Hoffman**, a Coastal marine and wetland science graduate student, was a co-author. Koepfler was also co-author on two other student posters including **Katrina Johnston's** (graduate student: CMWS) "Spatial and Temporal Influence of Meteorological and Substrate Factors upon Loggerhead Sea Turtle Nests in South Carolina" and **Nick Johnson's** (CCU marine science graduate) "High Resolution Mapping of Nesting Leatherback Body Temperatures in Costa Rica: Environmental and Metabolic Heat Exchange." These presentations included research outcomes of grants funded by the Savannah Presbytery and NOAA's Graduate Research fellowship programs.
