### CARIBBEAN FESTIVAL STARTS TODAY

USC Coastal Carolina College will take part in the USC - System Caribbean Festival beginning today with a cartography exhibit in room 101 in the Student Center.

The series of historical maps will depict the changing interpretation of the geography of the two regions during the past 300 years. It will be on campus through Sept. 24.

Other events at Coastal Carolina include:

- 7 p.m. Sept. 25 in Wheelwright Auditorium: The Okolo-Tegremantine Dancers of St. Kitts, who include drumming, folk singing, poetry and drama in their act.

- Sept. 27-Oct. 13 in room 207, Academic Building: The Caribbean Economic Exhibit is a free-standing panel with color photographs of the exotic lifestyles led in the island region.

- Oct. 4: A travelogue film entitled Caribbean Highlights.

- 8 p.m. Oct. 8 in Fine Arts Building: The Jamaican Folk Singers, a group of 25 men and women whose music expresses the cultural influence of the European and Arawak Indian heritage on their island nation.

The USC-System kicks off its Caribbean Festival today in Columbia.
