NURSING SCHOLARSHIPS

Scholarship applications for nursing and pre-nursing students are available through Dean of Nursing Office, Singleton Building.

The scholarships are to be awarded by the National Student Nurses' Association, Inc. The deadline for completed applications is Feb. 1. Scholarship funds will be awarded to recipients by spring 1986 for use in summer school and the 1986-87 academic year.

RESEARCH CLINICS

Students who need special assistance in learning how to do library research can make appointments for Kimbel Library's Research Clinics. These are 30-minute, individual appointments that

may be made by calling the Library's Information Desk or Reference Office. The service will be available through Nov. 22.

The Research Clinics are not intended to take the place of group library instruction, especially for introductory courses. The clinics are for use by students who need special help for specific term papers or research assignments.
