## **BHOPAL GAS LEAK IS SUBJECT OF RESEARCHER'S COASTAL CAROLINA VISIT**

Dr. M.P. Singh of the National Centre for Atmospheric and Fluid Sciences at the Indian Institute of Technology at New Delhi, will speak at 2 p.m. in room 120 of the Science Building. His topic will be "Dispersion of MIC in Bhopal Gas Leak Episode--Output from Mathematical Model."
