Powered by 21 hits by nine players, top seed Coastal Carolina dismantled second seed East Carolina 24-11 in the 2008 NCAA Baseball Conway Regional Championship Sunday, June 1 at Watson Stadium/Vrooman Field. With the win, the Chanticleers advance to the NCAA Super Regionals for the first time in program history as well as reached the 50-win mark for the third time in the last four seasons. Coastal will face No. 2 national seed North Carolina in the Super Regional as the Tar Heels won the Cary Regional by defeating UNC Wilmington 7-3 on Sunday.
