Coastal Carolina Theatre recently selected its cast for THE FIFTH OF JULY by Lanford Wilson, scheduled for February 21-23 in Wheelwright Performing Arts Center on the Coastal Carolina College campus.

Cast members are Curtis Lambert, David Loar, David Russell, Mavis Anderson, Melissa Brewer, Rebecca Perry, Carolina Trinks and Thomas E. Cowart. The director of the production is Professor Thomas E. Jones of the college's department of theatre and speech, and is assisted by Tim Harvey and Art Trinks, serving as assistant director and stage manager respectively.

THE FIFTH OF JULY is a fascinating look at some extraordinary people in a small town in the Midwest the day after the Bicentennial Fourth. One of the characters is this slightly dotty Aunt Sally (Caroline Trinks) who's carrying her Jewish husband's ashes around in a candy box. In the play we are dealing with four youngish musketeers of the embattled Berkely sixties, unfrocked revolutionaries uneasily splashing about in a 1976 Missouri backwater (and with their equally quixotic kinfolk or associates) as they nerviously try to make peace with peace.

"The Dream Keeper Speaks" is a dynamic evening of theater which presents a wide selection of Hughes' work - from the openly political poems of the 20s and 30s through the character sketches, dance and protest poems of the 40s, 50s and 60s.
