INTERIM DIRECTOR NAMED FOR GEORGETOWN EXTENSION

USC-Coastal Carolina College has named a full-time faculty member to head the Georgetown Extension.

Stewart Strothers, assistant professor of education and director of minority relations, will also serve as interim director of the USC-Coastal Carolina College Extension at Georgetown.

Strothers has been a Coastal faculty member for 11 years. He is also active in the Grand Strand community, including chairing the Mental Retardation Board and serving as a volunteer fireman.

"We are pleased that Stew Strothers has accepted the responsibility for the Georgetown campus," said Assistant Chancellor for Academic Affairs Dr. Sally Z. Hare. "He has taught at Georgetown, and he shares our goals and dreams for higher education in that area."
