### U.S. AMBASSADOR ON CAMPUS THIS WEEK

Former U.S. Ambassador to Romania David B. Funderburk will deliver a free public address at USC-Coastal Carolina College at 10:30 a.m. Wednesday, January 29th in Wheelwright Auditorium. Dr. Funderburk's appearance is sponsored by the department of history and government and the department of international affairs in conjunction with the International Affairs Council of the Carolinas. Now a Republican candidate for the U.S. Senate from North Carolina. Funderburk was appointed Ambassador to Romania by President Reagan in 1981 and served as the senior U.S. diplomat to the Soviet-bloc nation throughout Reagan's first term until retirement in 1985. At his appearance at Coastal, Funderburk will speak on U.S. foreign policy.

In addition to his morning address, the former ambassador will hold an informal discussion with faculty members, area high school teachers and interested members of the community at 7:30 p.m. in the Academic Building.

# "THE DREAM KEEPER SPEAKS: THE WORLD OF LANGSTON HUGHES"

Coastal Carolina College and the Langston Hughes Literary Society are pleased to present "The Dream Keeper Speaks: The World of Langston Hughes," a one-man show about America's best known black poet, Langston Hughes, based on 75 of his poems. Featuring the performance of actor John S. Patterson this collage of poetry, dance, music and mime reveals the humor and personality of Hughes as it mirrors the places and times in which he wrote. The New York Times referred to it as "a portrait through poetry." The performance has gained national attention and has been presented more than 100 times at colleges and theatres across the country.
