Coastal Carolina University board of trustees approves budget

The Coastal Carolina University board of trustees has approved a \$92.8 million operational budget for the 2008-2009 academic year. As part of the budget, the board approved a tuition increase of \$525 for in-state students, from \$3,800 to \$4,325 per semester. Out-of-state tuition will increase by \$750 per semester, from \$8,295 to \$9,045.
