INTERNATIONAL STUDENT EXCHANGE PROGRAM

The Office of International Programs seeks well qualified and motivated students, with or without foreign language skills, to study abroad under the International Student Exchange Program (ISEP). About sixty foreign universities all over the world are members of this program and accessible to our students with a minimum of formalities. Cost is \$1600 per semester (which includes an International Programs Scholarship) plus \$100 non-refundable application fee. This amount includes tuition, room, and board. The faculty and staff are kindly requested to make the students aware of this opportunity and to encourage them to consult with Dr. Bruno Gujer about it at the Office of International Programs.

BRITISH EXCHANGE PROGRAMS

Applications are being accepted from University of South Carolina students interested in participating in the Warwick Exchange Program in England. Four USC students will be selected to attend the University of Warwick in Coventry, England, for the 1986-87 academic year.

Rising sophomores, juniors and seniors from throughout the university system who have a history major, minor or cognate are eligible to apply. Participants will pay their regular tuition, housing costs and other fees to USC, while a large part of their travel expenses will be paid through a history department grant.

DRS. DENNIS WISEMAN, GILBERT HUNT, & LANCE BEDWELL have recently received notification that their paper titled "Advancing Critical Thinking Skills: Recommendations for Teacher Education" has been accepted for publication in The Professional Educator. This paper represents the written text of a conference presentation given by Drs. Wiseman and Hunt last fall at the Southeast Regional Association of Teacher Educators annual conference held in Montgomery, Alabama.
