GEORGE C. ROGERS AWARD NOMINATIONS

The Student Affairs Committee invites nominations for the college's annual George C. Rogers Award which will be presented at the annual Honors Convocation on April 29. 1986. Students eligible for this award must meet the following criteria: senior status and academic good standing; distinguish themselves in conspicuous service to the campus: be invloved significantly in campus organizations, groups, and activities; to have played a leadership role in one or more campus organizations or services; and have contributed significantly to the quality of campus life.

JOLLY NOMINATED FOR ALL-AMERICAN AWARD

Coastal Carolina College strength and conditioning coach, Ed Cerny, has nominated Chanticleer baseball pitcher Jack Jolly as the Coastal representative to possibly become one of the National Strength and Conditioning Association's 1986 All-American Athletes.

The criteria for the nomination is based upon the individual "who most effectively utilizes strength and conditioning to improve his or her athletic performance. Jolly is junior pitcher on Coastal's baseball team who starred at Myrtle Beach High School in the same sport.

ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE AWARD NOMINATIONS

The Student Affairs Committee will be sending a letter to all eligible students, inviting their selfnomination for consideration for the college's Academic Excellence Award. formally known as the Faculty General Excellence Award. This award will be presented at the college's annual Honor's Convocation on April 29, 1986. Students eligible for this award must satisfy the following criteria: be a graduating senior: have accumulated a 3.5 GPR or above: and have submitted the completed and signed nomination form for the Acedemic Excellence Award. In addition, that form must be signed by a faculty member who can certify the academic excellence as reflected by a "displine-related activity." Criteria for this award are: scholarship (3.5 GPR or above): academic excellence as can be certified by a faculty member; and academic achievement as reflected in honors and awards received.
