Summer mentoring students celebrate at Brookgreen

Twenty-four rising Georgetown County fifth-, sixth- and seventh-graders who have completed Coastal Carolina University's Summer CUB Learning Community: Communicating, Understanding and Believing program will participate in a grand finale celebration at Brookgreen Gardens on Thursday, July 17. The CUB Learning Community is part of the University's ongoing Dalton and Linda Floyd Family Mentoring Program with area K-12 schools. Participating students have been involved in an intensive four-week literacy program held at Carvers Bay Middle School. Events at Brookgreen Gardens include an awards ceremony, a presentation on Gullah culture and a tour of the zoo.

Get exercise while you aid research

The Department of Health, Physical Education and Recreation is inviting faculty and staff members who are 50 or older to participate in a research study at the Smith Exercise Science Lab. The purpose of this ongoing project, involving 50-plus individuals who perform at least some physical activity each week, is to examine the relationships between muscle strength, balance, anxiety and fear of experiencing an unintended fall. As part of the project, you will be asked to come to the Smith Exercise Science Lab for three sessions lasting no more than one hour. During these visits, participants will learn to use five pieces of strength training equipment, participate in a clinical balance test, and measure their maximal muscular strength on our computerized strength testing system. All information collected in the study is confidential; your name or identifying information will not be revealed to anyone outside of the study for any reason. Volunteers who participate in the program

usually learn more about the benefits of exercise, including muscular strength, especially as it relates to balance and the risk of falling. If you would like to participate or have additional questions, please contact yannessa@coastal.edu, or (843) 349-6460.
