The Clay Brittain Jr. Center for Resort Tourism reports that 81 percent of hotel rooms were filled the week of July 27 to Aug. 2, an increase of 8.3 percent over the same week last year. The weekend period was 94.4 percent occupied, down by 0.2 percent. The sixweek average from June 15 to July 26 showed 82.3 percent, down by 3.2 percent compared to last year. With more than 90 percent of vacation homes occupied, the Brittain Center is forecasting that the average occupancy level for its sample of hotels, condo-hotels and campsites for Aug. 8 and 9 could be near or above 97 percent, which may turn out to be the peak of the 2008 tourist season.
