Warning: bogus e-mail messages from addresses such as "COASTAL SUPPORT TEAM" have been circulating that claim to be from "COASTAL." Some of these messages state they are from "COASTAL messaging centre" and that the University is upgrading the data base and e-mail centre. They also request that recipients provide their user name, password and date of birth, etc. These e-mails did not come from Coastal Carolina University; rather, they are

phishing scams. Information Technology Services (ITS) warns recipients to not respond to the e-mails. If you receive an e-mail similar to what is described above, do not provide any of the requested information and delete the message immediately. Students, faculty and staff should NOT give their passwords to anyone under any circumstances. Your password must always be kept as secure as possible. In addition, the University (and other official organizations) will never require you to provide sensitive information such as passwords, credit card

numbers or social security information via e-mail.
