Student tickets for Chanticleer football games are available the week of the game only. Full-time Coastal Carolina University students with a valid ID may receive one ticket to each home game free of charge. Part-time students may purchase a student ticket for \$10. One student guest ticket may be purchased for \$10 by all eligible students (both full-and part-time students).

Designated student seating is in Sections 124, 125, 126 and 127 in the west stands.

Student seating is general admission.

Tickets are available at the Athletic Ticket Office at Brooks Stadium according to this schedule the week of the home game:

Monday though Friday

8:30 a.m. to 1 p.m. and 2 to 5 p.m.

Game Day (North Ticket Booth near tennis courts) 1 and 1/2 hours prior to kickoff

Students can still get Penn State tickets through Wednesday, Aug. 27 at 5 p.m. (\$61 each) by calling or stopping by the ticket office.
