STATE MATHEMATICS CONTEST HELD AT COASTAL

The seventh annual Coastal Carolina College Mathematics Contest for high school students in the state was held March 27 in Wheelwright Auditorium. The contest was started to promote interest and excellence in mathematics within the state. Another purpose of the event was to advance proficiency levels of high school mathematics students.

The 200 participants were given two different levels of mathematical proficiency tests. Level I covered up to, and including algebra II. The level II tests covered up to, and including calculus. Winners received trophies, medals, and personalized certificates. All participants received certificates of participation and t-shirts.

The contest was sponsored by USC Coastal Carolina College School of Mathematics and Computer Science, the Horry-Georgetown Mathematics Advancement Council, and the Coastal Educational Foundation. Codirectors for the event were Don E. Beken and John Mooningham.
