COMMENCEMENT TO BE HELD MAY 12

James S. Brady, assistant to the President and press secretary to President Ronald Reagan, will deliver the commencement address to Coastal graduates and guests Monday, May 12 at 7 p.m. in the Williams Brice Gymnasium. Mr. Brady and Justice James Woodrow Lewis of Darlington will receive honorary degrees during the ceremony.

The class of 1986 includes more than 360 graduates from May 1986, December 1985, and August 1985. Chancellor Eaglin will preside over the ceremony, and President Holderman will confer degrees. Dr. Hal Holmes, chairman of the Horry County Higher Education Commission, will deliver welcoming remarks.

Members of the class of 1986 who are participating in the program are: Ronald Dean Lackey, Jr. who will give the invocation; Michael J. Mongeon, class president, who will introduce Mr. Brady and lead the singing of the Alma Mater; and Herbert L. Williams who will give the benediction.

Dr. Elinor Miller will present the candidates for degrees, and diplomas will be presented by Dr. Holderman, Dr. Eaglin, and the deans. Claudia Cleary will announce the candidates.

The processional will be led by senior faculty member James Branham. Music will be provided by the Coastal Carolina Concert Choir directed by Lelia Smalley and the Coastal Wind Ensemble directed by Dr. William Hamilton.
