FOUNDATION GOLF TOURNEY SCHEDULED

The Coastal Educational Foundation will hold the inaugural Coastal Carolina Classic Golf Tournament Saturday, August 23 at Myrtle Beach National and Sunday, August 24 at Burning Ridge.

The format for the event is a two-person team, best ball, two-day tournament. The first day, players will play with 75% of their handicaps, and the second day, handicaps will be cut to 50%. The best ten gross scores will comprise the championship flight. Net flights will be determined, and there will be no more than ten teams per flight.

Tournament director Paul Stanton said the field will be limited to 70 teams, and they will be chosen on a first-come, first-served basis.

The cost of the event is \$150 per team (tax deductible) and includes 2 days of green fees, carts, cocktail party, refreshments on the course, and a fish fry.

COASTAL SOCCER PLAYER RECEIVES CHRISTENBERRY AWARD

Coastal soccer standout Don Pokorny has been named as the first recipient of the Big South Conference's annual Dr. George A. Christenberry Award for academic excellence achieved by a graduating senior athlete. This award will be

given annually to the senior athlete with the highest grade point average in the conference.

Pokorny, a St. Louis native, accumulated a 3.75 overall GPA and was named to the Dean's all four semesters while at Coastal. In May, he received his B.S. degree in experimental psychology and was the recipient of the Academic Award for Outstanding Achievement in Psychology. He attended Belleville Area Community College in Illinois before transferring to Coastal two years ago.

The Christenberry award is named in honor of Dr. George A. Christenberry who was charter president of the Big South Conference and was instrumental in its formation. He recently retired after 16 years as president of Augusta College and three years as president of the Big South.
