## COASTAL OFFERS "DISCOVER NEW DIRECTIONS" WORKSHOP FOR ADULTS

"Discover New Directions," a workshop for adults who are seeking new directions in life, will be offered by Coastal beginning Tuesday, August 5. The series consists of three workshops which meet August 5, 12, and 26 from 6:30 to 9 p.m. on campus and an independent study session that will be completed during the third week of August.

The workshop is designed to allow participants to re-assess themselves through a process of self-discovery. Participants will determine what they need to know about themselves; where they are in life and ways to change the things they want to change; facts they need to know to make the changes; and the commitment of time, money, and energy that is required if they plan to participate in further educational activities.

Workshop topics include discussions about personality profiles, the adult needs assessment that relates the personality profile to college degree programs and career fields, time management, stress management, listening skills, and notetaking hints.

## COASTAL OFFERS COLLEGE AFTER 25 PROGRAM

Adults who are planning to begin or return to college after being away

from the classroom for a period of time can find answers to many questions during "College After 25," a three-hour program offered by Coastal Wednesday, August 13, 6 p.m., in room 205 of the Student Center. The program also will be held Thursday, August 14 at the Georgetown Education Center.

The program is designed to address concerns that adults have as they consider continuing their education. Sessions will be led by Coastal faculty and staff who have experience in working with adult students.

In the opening session, participants will receive an overview of Coastal Carolina College and its extensions at Georgetown and Myrtle Beach. Topics such as degree programs, facilities, and athletics will be discussed. The introduction will be followed by sessions on admission and registration procedures; grants, scholarships, and loans; evening and off-campus programs; and career decisions. The program will close with an informal discussion of concerns and issues facing adult students. A reception with adult students, alumni, faculty, and staff will follow.

Registration is free to adults of any age who are contemplating enrolling in one or several courses at Coastal. However, since enrollment is limited, pre-registration is required. To register, phone the Office of Continuing Education, ext. 2672.
