CINO Grille will continue to be closed until the first or second week of February due to a construction delay in the renovation project. However, sandwiches, soups and salads will continue to be available for pick up just inside the front of the Lib Jackson Student Center. In addition, Bojangle's will be set up in front of the Student Center from 8 a.m. to 3 p.m. Mondays through Fridays.

Two new recycling programs have been established on campus. You can now recycle batteries (dry-cell, AA,AAA, cell phones, watches, etc.) at eight locations around campus: Waccamaw lobby; Wall building, first floor; Edwards College; Student Center; Coastal Science Center student lounge; Smith Science Building; Baxley Hall, bookstore; University Place, Activity House.

They are located between the Woods Residence Hall community and Waccamaw Hall next to the basketball court. The drop-off carts are a pilot program.
