PROGRAM FOR FIRST-YEAR TEACHERS TO BE HELD AUGUST 20 ON CAMPUS

The Coastal Education Consortium is sponsoring a program for first-year teachers from Horry, Georgetown, and Williamsburg Counties Wednesday, August 20 from 8:30 a.m. to noon at Coastal.

Dr. Charlie Williams, state superintendent of education, will deliver the keynote address at 9:15 a.m. in Wheelwright Auditorium. His topic will be "The Education Improvement Act - Year Three." Following his address, five concurrent sessions dealing with more specific issues will be offered. Teachers will attend two sessions of their choice.

The sessions and their presenters are: Secondary Classroom Management, Chip Brown, assistant principal, Conway High School; Elementary/Middle School Classroom Management, Dr. Michael Borovicka, principal, Waccamaw Elementary School; Program for Effective Teaching (PET), Ella Edwards, staff coordinator, Georgetown County Schools; Preparing for the Profession-A Positive Mindset, Dr. Elizabeth Puskar, dean, School of Social and Behavioral Sciences, Coastal Carolina College; and Preparing for Instruction in Rural Settings, Dr. Dennis Wiseman, dean, School of Education, Coastal Carolina College.

Mr. John Dawsey, superintendent for Horry County Schools will deliver opening remarks and a welcome to teachers and guests.

o DR. JAMES H. REX, vice chancellor for academic affairs, was recently appointed to a national advising group in Washington, D. C. which will implement a new Center for Change in Teacher Education. o DR. SUBHASH SAXENA, professor of mathematics, attended the International Congress of Mathematicians in Berkeley, California August 3-11. A special feature of the congress is the presentation of the Fields Metal which recognizes outstanding achievement in mathematics. Since there is no Nobel Prize in mathematics, the award is recognized by many as the highest honor a research mathematician can receive.
