o DR. AL HALL, professor of foreign languages, recently attended the annual conference of the American Association of Teachers of German in West Berlin. While in Europe, he also visted the Universities of Saarbruecken and Strasbourg and the Sorbonne.

o DR. DON BEKEN, assistnat professor of mathematics and computer science, attended a summer institute in applied mathematics at Ricks College in Idaho. The institute was sponsored by the American Mathematics Association.

o DR. SUSAN LIBES, assistant professor of marine science, has been awarded \$730 from the Southern Regional Education Board to continue her research in nitrogen isotope geochemistry.

This paper is based on a year of studies on oyster reefs in North Inlet near Georgetown and will be published in the journal, Continental Shelf Research. While in Plymouth, Dame will visit Citadel Hill, the home of the Marine Biological Association of the United Kingdom, the second oldest Marine Laboratory in the world.

o DR. ROBERT SQUATRIGLIA, associate chancellor of student development, recently attended the 38th annual conference of the Association of College and University Housing Officers-International hosted by Western Carolina University. More than 1000 housing officers attended the four-day meeting, including representatives from all 50 states, Australia, Canada, Europe, Malaysia, Mexico, and Saudi Arabia.
