COASTAL CAROLINA PEOPLE

o Chancellor Ron Eaglin was invited to speak to the American Association of State Colleges and Universities during their annual meeting last week in Phoenix, Arizona. His topic was "Academic and Public Leadership." The organization is comprised of more than 1200 member institutions from across the nation. Six hundred state college and university presidents attended the conference.

o Dr. Susan Libes, assistant professor of marine science, recently attended a week-long

training session in High Vacuum Technology sponsored by the American Vacuum Society. The program was held in Baltimore, Maryland.

o **Dr. Dennis Wiseman**, dean of the School of Education, and **Dr. Gilbert Hunt**, professor of education, recently gave a presentation at the 33rd annual conference of the Southeastern Regional Association of Teacher Educators held in Charleston. The title of their presentation was "Addressing the Issues of Rural Education."

o **Dr. Anne Graves**, assistant professor of special education, is conducting a research project investigating reading comprehension teaching techniques for learning disabled children. The schools which will be included in the study are Loris Middle, Loris Elementary, Lakewood Elementary, and Green Sea Floyds Middle. The project involves 60 learning disabled students who will each receive eight training sessions and three testing sessions. The research, which has been designed to compare four different "finding the main ideas" teaching strategies, will yield information regarding effective, efficient teaching.

o **Ed Cerny**, assistant professor of business administration, was the guest speaker at the officer and member installation of the Future Business Leaders Association at Whiteville High School. The ceremony took place November 3 at the high school.

o **Dr. Lynn Smith**, associate librarian; **Charmaine Tomczyk**, associate librarian; and **Janice Schuster**, assistant librarian, recently attended the annual conference of the South Carolina Library Association in Columbia. The theme was "Mandates for an Information Profession: Change, Create, Cooperate."

o **Claudia McCollough Cleary**, assistant professor of philosophy, has been named as a recipient of a Sloan Foundation

fellowship to participate in the winter workshop entitled "Enlightenment: The Best Security in a Nuclear-Armed World." The Sloan Foundation announced the awards November 1. Twenty-five college professors from the Southeast were selected to participate in the week-long workshop to be held in Miami, Florida, in January.

o **Dr. Richard Dame**, professor of marine science, recently published an article with Coastal Carolina College graduate **Paul Kenney**. The article, "Variability of *Spartina Alterniflora* Primary Production in the Euhaline North Inlet Estuary," was published in the International Journal of Marine Ecology. The paper describes, for the first time, the amount of new plant material produced by marsh grass in a South Carolina Estuary. In addition, they report that marsh grass growth is twice as high in wet years as dry years which implies that the productivity of coastal marshes may fluctuate dramatically from year to year. The work was supported by a National Science Foundation grant to the Belle W. Baruch Institute for Marine Biology and Coastal Research.

o **Dr. James Rex**, vice chancellor for academic affairs, has been appointed at the rank of professor with tenure by the USC Board of Trustees.

o **Dr. Douglas Nelson**, professor of geology and marine science, recently attended a conference at the Virginia Institute of Marine Science. The meeting brought together investigators of continental shelf sediments from along the Atlantic coast. Nelson has been researching the deposits in our area for several years in cooperation with the United States Geologic Survey.

o **Audrey Garland**, coordinator of continuing education, spoke at the November meeting of the Surfside area chapter of the American Association of Retired Persons. Her topic was educational

programs for older adults at Coastal.

o **Carolyn Cox**, assistant professor of music, was clinician at a county-wide high school music clinic held at Conway High School, Friday, November 7. The following high schools participated: Conway, Myrtle Beach, North Myrtle Beach, Loris, Aynor, and Green Sea-Floyds. The Coastal Carolina Concert Choir presented a short program at the conclusion of the clinic. o **Steve Nagle**, assistant professor of English, presented "Morphological and Syntactic Developments in the Middle English Modal as Principled Change" at the Southeastern Conference on Linguistics held in Atlanta, November 3.

o **Barbara Driver**, assistant professor of business administration, and **Will Garland**, associate professor of business administration, recently attended a workshop on Microcomputers for Accounting Education at Virginia Tech, Blacksburg, Virginia.

o **Dr. Lance Bedwell**, associate professor of education, presented a session at the South Carolina Science Conference held recently in Columbia. His presentation dealt with the improvement of instruction through environmental education. The South Carolina Science Conference is a statewide organization of science teachers.
