#### VISITING SCIENTIST TO GIVE PUBLIC SEMINAR

Dr. Heinrich K. Eichhorn, professor of astronomy at the University of Florida, will give a public seminar Tuesday, January 27 at 1:30 p.m. in Room 120 in the Science Building. o Donald J. Millus, professor of English, recently had an article published in Moreana, the publication of the St. Thomas More Society, in Algers, France. The article entitled "The Tyndale Edition: Still Underground" appeared in the November issue of the publication. William Tyndale was the principle translator used in the King James version of the Bible. Millus is a member of the editorial board for the publication of Tyndale's controversial works.
