GEORGE C. ROGERS SERVICE AWARD NOMINATIONS

The Student Affairs Committee will examine and consider all candidates, develop a campus ballot, and

STATISTICS PACKAGE AVAILABLE FOR PC

Coastal's Computer Services has obtained a site license for the statistical/data management program BASS. The program is source code compatible to SAS, and has most of the procedures available in the Base SAS product. BASS has chosen Coastal as a beta test site for several new products it will be marketing soon, including an advanced statistics module very similar to the SAS/STAT product. This makes it ideal for use with the micros available in the labs on campus. A copy of the program can be obtained through CSD for \$10. Manuals are also available for \$14.95.
