"SHOAH" TO BE SHOWN APRIL 27-29

"SHOAH" a documentary about the Holocaust as seen through the eyes of survivors, perpetrators, and bystanders, will be shown in three parts at the college on Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday, April 27-29 in the Fine Arts Building from 7:30 to 10:30 p.m.

"SHOAH" contains none of the horrifying images one would expect from a film about the Holocaust. Instead, it presents an assemblage of witness whose combined testimony amounts to one of the most shattering human documents ever recorded. The film is nine-and-a-half hours long; however, since there is no storyline, it is not necessary to see the entire film to appreciate its subject matter.

The program is co-sponsored by the college and Temple Emanu-EL of Myrtle Beach. It is free and open to the public. For more information, contact the Public Relations Office.

STUDENTS PRESENT PAPERS AT REGIONAL CONFERENCE

Five Coastal Carolina students were invited to present their research papers at the prestigious Carolina's Psychology Conference, a regional meeting of undergraduate students in psychology and related fields. The conference was held recently at North Carolina State University in Raleigh, North Carolina. Students were required to submit abstracts of their papers for consideration prior to the conference, and all of the Coastal students who submitted papers were accepted. The students are: Susan Tice of Woodsville, Ohio whose paper was entitled "Spouse Abuse: A Descriptive Analysis;" Jane Robertson-Cox of Myrtle Beach whose topic was "The Use of Biofeedback Training in the Reduction of Intensity and Frequency of Tension Headaches;" Sandra James of Loris who researched "Biofeedback and the Treatment of Tinnitus;" Nicola Vlassis of Myrtle Beach who researched "The Effects of Olfactory Cues on Memory;" and Gregory Booth of Myrtle Beach whose paper was entitled "Predicting Length of Psychiatric Hospitalization for Adolescent Inpatients." Although Booth's paper was accepted, he could not present at the conference due to an issue over the confidentiality of his data.

Vlassis and Tice have also been invited to present their papers at the first annual National Conference on Undergraduate Research to be held April 23-25 at UNC-Ashville.
