COMMENCEMENT ACTIVITIES

May 9: 5:30 p.m.

Graduation rehearsal will be held on Saturday, May 9 from 5:30 to 6:30 p.m. in the Williams-Brice Gymnasium. It is important that those graduates participating in Commencement attend. The Alumni Association will present each graduate with a pocket-size miniature diploma (an exact duplicate of the "real" thing) at rehearsal as a gift, welcoming them into the Alumni Association.

May 9: 6:30 - 8 p.m.

The Coastal Carolina Alumni Association will host a "Garden Party" for all May graduates immediately following the rehearsal. Graduates and their families are invited to attend this reception to be held in Spadoni Park in front of Wheelwright Auditorium. Chancellor Eaglin, faculty, college administration, and alumni will be present to share in congratulating our newest alumni. (Rain location is Wheelwright Auditorium.)

May 10: Commencement 4 p.m.
Commencement will be held at 4 p.m. in the Williams-Brice Gymnasium. Graduates will assemble in the Student Center. (Rain location is Williams-Brice Building.) A special reception, hosted by the Coastal Alumni Association, will be held immediately following the ceremony on the patio of the Fine Arts Building.

May 10: Graduate & Family Photos
Immediately following the Commencement Exercise, the Alumni Association will sponsor photograph sessions for graduates and their families. Single portrait or

family portraits can be made. Photographs will be taken on a first-come, first-served basis and usually takes no more than five minutes. Payments must be made at time of the order. The photographs will be mailed to graduates within three to four weeks from the Alumni Office.

The ninth annual Mathematics Contest was held at Coastal on Thursday, April 23. More than 200 students from twenty-two high schools participated in the competition, which was sponsored by Coastal's School of Mathematics and Computer Science, the Coastal Educational Foundation, Inc., and the Mathematics Advancement Council of Horry-Georgetown.

In the opening ceremony, Dr. Joseph Cicero, dean of the School of Mathematics and Computer Science, welcomed the participants to campus and introduced Colonel Joseph J. Redden, commanding officer of the 354th Tactical Fighter Wing, Myrtle Beach Air Force Base, who gave some brief remarks about the importance of mathematics.

**CERNY NAMED DIRECTOR
OF MBA PROGRAM AT COASTAL**

Ed Cerny, assistant professor of marketing, has been named Internship director and director of MBA Programming for the E. Craig Wall, Sr. School of Business Administration. Beginning this fall, the University of South Carolina will offer a professional MBA program via ETV on the Coastal Carolina campus.

Although ETV-MBA has been in existence since 1970, there will be a new emphasis placed on three campuses within the USC system. The three campuses are USC Aiken, Coastal, and Spartanburg.

At Coastal, a classroom will be renovated this summer to create a tiered, u-shaped seating arrangement. In addition, an 8 foot square television screen will be installed along with electronic

hardware to communicate directly with the classroom instructor in Columbia.
