ABLE Program Receives Governor's Award

The Coastal Carolina College ABLE Program (A Better Lifestyle Experience) has received the 1987 Governor's Award for Health Promotion for Older South Carolinians. The program was initiated in 1985 by Dr. Marshall Parker, assistant dean of education, and is offered through the School of Education under the direction of Dr. Dennis Wiseman, dean for the School of Education.

ABLE combines a number of health promotion areas, including control of cholesterol, sodium, caloric intake, and blood pressure. It also teaches methods for managing stress, eliminating smoking, and exercising. The program is offered as both a credit and non-credit course and has served over 300 participants.

Health promotion has been defined as "any combination of health education and related organizational, political and economic interventions designed to facilitate behavioral and environmental changes conducive to health." Many kinds of activities and programs meet this broad definition. Recipients of the Governor's Award must demonstrate involvement in two or more of the following areas of prevention: enhanced exercise and fitness, improved nutrition, reduced alcohol and drug misuse, accident prevention, stress reduction, use of preventive services, and development or use of support systems.

The Governor's Award recognizes those projects which are contributing to the current well-being of older people and building the base for future efforts throughout South Carolina.

St. Francis Xavier Hospital in Charleston was also a recipient of this award.
