Administrative Changes Made in Student Development

Student Development Division services have been clustered in a modest reorganization which provides for effective and efficient service delivery and future flexibility and growth. The three administrative clusters of the division are: Residence Life, Student Life and Group Activities, and Counseling Services. This is consistent with personnel actions recently completed to include the promotion of Patricia Singleton to assistant dean of Student Development; the hiring of Kim Montague as director of Residence Life; and the expansion of Counseling Services under Dr. Joseph Mazurkiewicz.

Singleton, formerly director of Student Activities, will supervise the Office of Student Activities, the Student Center, the Office of Minority Student Relations, and orientation; and is responsible for governance and judicial matters. She will act in the absence of the associate chancellor for Student Development.

Montague, director of Residence Life, will be responsible for on- and off-campus housing information, together with the administration of the college's residence life program including governance and judicial processes.

In the counseling services cluster, Mazurkiewicz will supervise individual and group counseling for students, the Office of Career Planning and Placement, the newly established Job Locator Service, the Office of Financial Aid and Veterans Affairs, and the Office of Student Health Information Service.

Aerobics Class Offered at P.E. Center

A non-credit course in intermediate aerobics is being offered by the Physical Education Center.

Intermediate aerobics is designed for the person who is interested in a good exercise program.

The class emphasizes a slow warm-up and stretch of individual muscle groups. It stresses a safe start for any fitness program. Each class is a full 50-60 minutes of exercise done to music. You will be able to tone and firm muscles while you increase your cardiovascular fitness as well.
