## Vrooman Signs All-State Second Baseman

Coastal Carolina Head Baseball Coach John Vrooman has announced that All-State second baseman Pierce Taylor of Georgetown High School has signed a national letter of intent to play baseball for the Chanticleers in 1987-88.

Taylor was one of 25 players selected to the South Carolina All-State team after collecting 34 hits in 74 trips to the plate (.431 average), stealing 17 bases in as many attempts and hitting three homers while driving in 12 runs.

## Connie Signs Two All-State CC Runners

Coastal Carolina Women's Cross Country Coach Alan Connie has announced that he has signed All-State runners Lisa Ferrara and Sonja Vertacnik, both of Bellmore, New York.

Ferrara posted an 18:22 (min:sec) time in the 5,000 meter, a 2:14 in the 800 meter, and a 4:50 in the 1,500 meter event last season in gaining All-Nassau County, All-Area, and All-New York State honors while she competed for Mepham High School under the direction of head coaches Ray Hughes and Paul Limmer. She was also a gold medalist in the Penn Relays during her sophomore year.

Vertacnik, teammate with Ferrara at Mepham High School, had a career best of 18:31 in the 5,000 meter event, a 2:22 in the 800 meter, and a 5:05 in the 1,500 meter race. She was also named to the All-County squad and was selected All-State honorable mention.
