

Football Club Not Affiliated With College

Recent publicity about the Coastal Carolina Football Club has led some people in the community to believe that Coastal Carolina College has a club football team. This is not the case. The following letter from Dr. Eaglin addresses this issue:

I would like to state the college's position on the Coastal Carolina Football Club which has been mentioned in the local news media.

First, the organization has no connection, whatsoever, with USC Coastal Carolina College or with any segment of the institution. This includes our Athletic Department, the CINO Booster Club, the Physical Education Center, and Student Activities.

It is not recognized nor in any way endorsed by Coastal Carolina College, and no college funds have been, or will be allocated to the organization. Donations made to the organization do not come to the college, and those who are soliciting funds do not represent the college or have authorization to use the college's name in their solicitation.
