"A Midsummer Night's Dream" To Be Presented Sept. 24

The Cultural Arts Series' first presentation of the year, "A Midsummer Nights' Dream," will be held Thursday, September 24, 8 p.m. in Wheelwright Auditorium.

The North Carolina Shakespeare Festival from High Point, North Carolina, a professional company that was formed in 1977, will present the play. Tickets are \$7 general admission and \$4 students. Series tickets for all four 1987-88 events are still available at a cost of \$25 for general admission (a savings of \$3 dollars over individual prices), \$20 for Coastal faculty/staff and senior citizens (a savings of \$7), and \$5 for Coastal students (a savings of \$11).

Coastal Carolina Hosts Fourteenth Annual Fishing Tournament

USC Coastal Carolina College will host six teams of collegiate anglers this month for the Fourteenth Annual Coastal Carolina Invitational, the nation's

only intercollegiate fishing match and seminar. This unique event combines deep-sea fishing competition with seminars on the environment and the future of sportfishing. The participating colleges are Clemson University, Yale University, Western Ontario University, Francis Marion College, the University of North Carolina, and the host school Coastal Carolina.

Student anglers will stay at Springmaid Beach and participate in seminars that will be open to the public at no extra charge. Seminar programs are scheduled for Springmaid Pier September 23 and 24. Topics will include bait rigging for kings and billfish and the newly passed anti-netting legislation designed to protect spotted sea trout and spottail bass. The student anglers will fish on the "Capt. Juel II" out of Little River and on the "New Capt. Bill" out of Murrells Inlet.
