"A Midsummer Night's Dream" To be Presented Sept. 24

The Cultural Arts Series' first presentation of the year, "A Midsummer Night's Dream," will be held Thursday, September 24, 8 p.m. in Wheelwright Auditorium.

The North Carolina Shakespeare Festival from High Point, North Carolina, a professional company that was formed in 1977, will present the play. Tickets are \$7 general admission and \$4 students. Series tickets for all four 1987-88 events are still available at a cost of \$25 for general admission (a savings of \$3 dollars over individual prices), \$20 for Coastal faculty/staff and senior citizens (a savings of \$7), and \$5 for Coastal students (a savings of \$11).
