"Cat on a Hot Tin Roof" to Open Theatre Series"

Tennessee Williams's funny and wrenching Southern drama, "Cat on a Hot Tin Roof," will be presented as the opening play of the 1987-88 Coastal Carolina Theatre Series in Wheelwright Auditorium on Friday, October 9 at 8 p.m.; Saturday, October 10 at 8 p.m., and Sunday, October 11 at 2:30 p.m.

"Cat on a Hot Tin Roof" is considered one of Williams's best plays. The New York Times called it "pure theatre." The New York Daily Mirror said "Cat" may be the closest play the American theatre has which combines "the actual blood and bone of life" with the "natural poetry" of one of America's greatest playwrights.

At the center of the action is Maggie, portrayed by Eleanor Kelly, the cat on the hot tin roof who is fighting for her marriage. antagonist is her taciturn and evasive husband, Brick, played by Archie Buchan. Kelly is a newcomer to the Coastal Carolina Theatre and Buchan was previously seen in "A Funny Thing Happened on the Way to the Forum." Horace Wood is featured as the dying Big Daddy, a self-made, earthy plantation owner who boasts that he's been like a doubled up fist, pounding, smashing, driving toward wealth. Wood, who teaches in the School of Education at Coastal, previously "died" on the Wheelwright stage in last season's "Wayside Motor Inn."

Others in the cast, drawn from Coastal faculty and students as well as community members, include Claudia McCollough Cleary as the outspoken mother, Big Mamma. Mike Evans will be seen as Gooper, Brick's scheming brother obsessed with plans to inherit the father's estate. Robin Armitage-Majewski will portray Mae, Gooper's greedy, snappish wife. Other cast members are Margaret Fain, Danny Nale, Brett A. Perry, Ian Proveaux, David F. Russell, and Rebecca C. Young.

The Coastal production is directed by Professor David E. Millard. Professor David E. Majewski (set), Timothy M. Harvey (lighting), and Robin Armitage-Majewski (costumes) comprise the design team.

Tickets are \$5 for general admission and \$2.50 for students, and are available at the Wheelwright Box Office, ext. 2502.
