Dr. Gary McDowell Is Third Speaker In Bicentennial Series

"The Politics of Original Intention: Judge Bork and the Constitution," the third in a series of three programs celebrating the bicentennial of the U. S. Constitution, will be held Tuesday, November 17 at 2:30 p.m. in the Fine Arts Little Theatre.

The speaker is Dr. Gary McDowell, resident scholar at the Center for Judicial Studies in Washington, D.C. and articles editor for the center's publication, *Benchmark*. Dr. McDowell is also a Woodrow Wilson Fellow of the Smithsonian Institute and recently appeared on Nightline and The Macneil-Lehrer Report during the Bork controversy.

Until March 1987, McDowell was the associate director of the Office of Public Affairs at the U.S. Department of Justice where he served as chief speech writer to Attorney General Edwin Meese. Prior to his service at the Justice Department, McDowell was the director of the Office of the Bicentennial of the U.S. Constitution at the National Endowment for the Humanities.

Before entering government service, McDowell taught political science at Newcomb College of

Tulane University and at Dickinson College. He earned a Ph.D. in government and public affairs at the University of Virginia, an A.M. in political science at the University of Chicago, and a B.A. in social sciences at the University of South Florida.

McDowell is the author of several books including *Curbing the Courts: The Constitution and the Limits of Judicial Power* and *The Constitution and Contemporary Constitutional Theory*. His numerous essays and reviews on the Constitution and constitutional law have been published in *the Public Interest*, *Publius*, *The Wall Street Journal*, and *The New York Times*.

Dr. John L. Safko To Present Seminar

The seminar on Pseudoscience will be conducted Monday, November 23 at 1:30 p.m., and Tuesday, November 24 at 11:30 a.m., in room 120 of the Science Building. Many forms of pseudoscience, including astrology, will be discussed from a scientist's viewpoint.

Tuesday, November 24 at 8 p.m., Dr. Safko will give a public lecture in the Fine Arts Little Theatre, entitled "Gravity and Black Holes." The talk will not be overly technical. It will be of special interest to those who want to learn something about one of the fundamental forces in nature and about some of the most bizarre objects that astronomers believe populate our universe.

Two of his pieces are presently on exhibition as part of the Thirteenth International Independent Exhibition of Prints in Kauagawa, Kauagawa Prefectural Gallery, Yokahama, Japan.
