## Coastal Student Named South Carolina Student Legislature's Lieutenant Governor

Mark Porter, a junior at Coastal, was voted South Carolina Student Legislature's Lieutenant Governor by a representative body of the student population of the state during the recent assembly of the 32nd annual session of the South Carolina Student Legislature. Mark campaigned against a delegate from Clemson University, winning the small school coalition, to attain this prestigious office. The Coastal Carolina delegation, as well as the entire SCSL body feels confident that Mark will serve his state well.

Coastal proudly sent a seven member delegation; two delegates served in the Senate and the remaining five served in the House of Representatives. Coastal also had a representative on each of the Standing Committees. A member of our delegation competed in the race for the office of President Pro Tempore. Members of Coastal's delegation were asked to introduce candidates for the offices of Lieutenant Governor and Governor.

South Carolina Student Legislature is an organization funded by the state as a practical educational experience for our state's future leaders. The body comprised a mock legislature, executive and judiciary that dealt with issues and concerns fostered in our society. In the form of amendments, bills and resolutions, this year's session tackled such issues as sex education, AIDS, death penalty, buggery, and the confederate flag.
