Dr. Robert D. Nale Appointed Assistant Dean

Dr. Robert D. Nale has accepted the position of Assistant Dean of the E. Craig Wall Sr. School of Business Administration and Computer Science, effective July 1, 1988.

Dr. Nale joined the faculty in the fall of 1985 as an assistant professor in the area of management, after having taught at Monmouth College in Monmouth, IL since 1978. Coastal Carolina Theatre to Present "Charley's Aunt"

Brandon Thomas's Victorian farce, "Charley's Aunt," opens December 11 at 8:00 p.m. in Wheelwright Auditorium. The weekend run includes a performance on Saturday, December 12, at 8:00 p.m. and Sunday, December 13, at 2:30 p.m.

This comedy retains a freshness and spontaneity which has made it one of the most popular farce comedies in the English language. The play is a series of burlesque situations revolving around a Yale student's (Oxford in the original) wealthy aunt from Brazil who fails to arrive in time to chaperon two young couples at a party and who is therefore impersonated by another college student.

The complications that result from Charley's "aunt" scampering through the halls of Yale, clad in a wig and ill-fitting dress, and being courted by a couple of dignified gentlemen, may not be refined, but they have been found hilarious by audiences all over the world. The hilarity increases when the real aunt unexpectedly arrives and is introduced to "herself." "Charley's Aunt" was first performed in London in 1892. The Coastal Carolina Theatre production has been adapted for an American audience by the directors, Robin Armitage-Majewski, adjunct instructor in the School of Humanities and Fine Arts, and Robin W. Edwards, Jr., a Coastal graduate. The setting has been moved from Oxford, England to Yale University, and many popular American terms have been neatly substituted for the British dialogue.

Featured in the cast are William J. Rivers, III as Lord Fancourt Babberley, or just plain "Babbs," the Yaley who poses as Charley's "aunt." Timothy M. Harvey will be seen as Jack Chesney, and Gregory Cooper will portray Charley Wyckeham, the two young men in search of love. Supporting these lads will be Jacqueline Rebekah Browne and Cathy Callaham as Kitty Verdun and Amy Spettigue, the young women in need of a chaperon. Also featured will be Caroline Trinks as Donna Lucia d'Alvadorez, Charley's "real" aunt.

Health Tip for the Week: Movie Theatre Popcorn

According to "Nutrition Action Healthletter," most movie theatres pop their corn in coconut oil, a fat more saturated than lard. The reason appears to be that they find it easier to heat the oil in advance and keep it at a temperature, roughly 600 degrees, that would cause most oils to smoke.

Why not take your own air-popped corn, or corn popped in a small amount of corn, soy or safflower oil, seasoned with more garlic powder than salt.
