

Safety Health Tip for the week:

How to be a good host or hostess when serving alcoholic drinks:

- l. Offer soft drinks...one third of the adult population chooses not to drink alcohol at all.
- 2. Give more than a drink...introduce two people who don't know each other and get a conversation started.
- 3. Don't rush refills...wait until the glass is empty before you offer another drink.
- 4. Keep them nibbling...while your guests are drinking alcohol.
- 5. Dinner is served...do it before it's too late.
- 6. If someone drinks too much alcohol at your home, you are responsible. That's part of being a good host or hostess. See that they get home safely, but don't let them drive. Only time can sober a person up, not coffee or a cold shower. It will take about an hour for every drink they've had. If they must get home and you or one of your friends can't

drive them home call a cab. A life is worth it!

o Dr. Sally Z. Hare, assistant chancellor Academic Affairs and director of Continuing Education and Graduate Studies, has been selected to participate in the 1987-88 class of Leadership South Carolina.

Administered by the Byrnes International Center at the University of South Carolina, LSC was created by former governor Richard W. Riley in 1979 to identify outstanding young leaders in the state, provide them with an opportunity to advance their leadership qualities and increase their understanding of issues facing the state.

- o Pat Singleton-Young, assistant dean of student development, and her husband, Freddie, proudly announce the birth of their son, Ryan Freddie, weighing 7 lbs., 4 oz., on December 9. Both mother and baby are doing fine.
- o Daniel A. Selwa, associate professor of geography and chair of the departments of government and geography, attended the Southeastern Division Forty-Second Meeting of the Association of American Geographers (SEDAAG) held in Charlotte, NC, Nov. 22-24.
- o Dr. Jacqueline L. Gmuca, assistant professor of English, presented a session, "Images of the South in Children's Literature,: at the October Whole Language conference, "The Whole Is Greater Than the Sum of Its Parts." As director of the Coastal Area Writing Project, she has served in several capacities recently, coordinating two fall meetings for participants of the 1987 Writing Institute and Writing Project teachers from Horry County as well as conducting the first meeting of The Writing Group from Socastee High School. She will continue to serve throughout the year as a resource person for these students, grades 9-12, interested in writing.
- o Tim Touzel, associate professor elementary education, recently presented a paper, "Estimation: The Most Basic Skill," at the annual conference of the South Carolina Council of the Teachers of Mathematics in Columbia, SC. He was also asked to present the paper and a related discussion at an NSF sponsored institute at USC-Spartanburg in June.
- o Douglas Nelson, professor marine science and geology, recently presented a talk to the executive committee of South Carolina's Sierra Club. The purpose was to inform the group about the causes of beach erosion in South Carolina and the scientific basis for proposed solutions. The executive committee used information from this presentation to evaluate how the Sierra Club will respond to a bill before the State Legislature next year.
- o Dr. Marshall Parker, assistant dean of education and health professions, served last week on the Southern Association of College and Schools Visiting Committee at Hannah Pamplico High School in Florence County.
- o Dr. Bob Neilson, assistant professor of physical

education, addressed the Region 2 National Intramural Recreational Sports Association at Charlottesville, Va. on December 4. His multimedia presentation on "A Unique Overseas Recreational Sports Experience" highlighted his experiences as a civilian Recreational Sports Specialist for the U. S. Navy in Guantanamo Bay, Cuba (the only US military installation on communist territory). Also, the topic covered Dr. Neilson's experiences as assistant dean of a teaching center at the largest Royal Saudi Air Force Base in the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia where he developed fitness, athletic and recreation programs.

o Mr. Mike Battle, of the law firm Lovelace & Battle, spoke to two English classes on December 2. His subject was "The Ten Commandments of Business Legal Writing."


